## Trauma + ACEs

#### Adverse Childhood Experiences

- Domestic violence
- Divorce
- Emotional & sexual abuse
- Maternal depression
- Physical & emotional neglect
- Substance abuse
- Incarceration
- Mental illness
- Homelessness

#### Adverse Community Experiences

- Poverty & violence
- Poor housing quality & affordability
- Discrimination
- Lack of opportunity, economic mobility, and/or social capital

#### Adverse Environment Experiences

- Wildfires
- Droughts
- Climate change
- Environmental injustice
- Hurricanes
- Floods
- Pollution
- COVID-19

#### Adverse Cultural Experiences

- Genocide
- Slavery
- Colonization
- Forced family separation
- Segregation
- Harmful social norms

#### **Trauma Aware**

- Emphasis in this stage is on building knowledge and beginning to change attitudes
- Individuals are trained in the basics of trauma and are familiar with the values and terminology of trauma-informed care
- Leadership, faculty, and staff understand how trauma impacts students and peers

#### **Trauma Sensitive**

- readiness for change
- employees

#### **Trauma Responsive**

- Emphasis in this stage is continued knowledge building and promoting cultural shift towards trauma-informed care
- The individual begins to integrate trauma-informed principles into behavior and practice

#### **Trauma Informed**

- endeavors
- approach to education

• Emphasis in this stage is continued knowledge building and creating • Individuals begin to see those with whom they interact through a trauma lens • Institutions promote training and professional development for all


• Emphasis in this stage is on continuous improvement and monitoring of trauma-informed knowledge, skills, and attitudes throughout personal and professional
